

Year 2 Homework – Summer 2

Below is a list of different homework activities you can do with your child. Please aim to do one activity a week. Complete the activities in your child's homework book or stick a photograph in.

Maths:

- Create a tally chart of different plants. Go on a plant walk in your garden or at the park and tally how many of them you see.
Tell the time: o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. NB: Please practise on an analogue clock.
- Make your own clock with moving hands. What times can you make?
- Practise your multiplication & division e.g. $20 \div 5 = 4$ (2s, 5s, 10s and 3s)
(make a sets of multiplication and division memory cards. Write the question on one side of a piece of card and the answer on the back – test yourself or get someone to test you)
- Collect different objects from around your house. Count how many you have. See if you can find half of the number of objects (make two groups). Can you find $\frac{1}{4}$? $\frac{2}{4}$? $\frac{3}{4}$? Try finding $\frac{1}{3}$
- Measure different plants/or leaves at the park or in your garden. Put them in order from shortest to longest.

Science:

- Go on a mini beast hunt with your family. What mini beasts have you found?
- Use the internet or a book to research a weird and wonderful mini beast. Perhaps find out about the Borneo walking stick or the Goliath beetle. Make a poster to display amazing facts that you can show your friends at school.
- Write a list of adjectives to describe what spiders look like and a list of verbs to describe what spiders do. Use the lists to write six facts about spiders and make up a story about a spidery adventure.
- Make a non-fiction book about mini beasts. Include a title, headings, a contents page, an index, downloaded images and drawings.

Spelling:

- Go through the 100 and 200 high frequency words. Practise the ones that you find the trickiest! Write them into a sentence!
