



London



Our new topic is 'London'. Please choose at least one thing from the list below each week and record it in your book. Homework books will be sent home on Wednesdays and need to be returned to school on Mondays for your teacher to mark.

- Visit London with a grown up! How did you get there? What did you see? Bring photos of your trip into school to share with your class or use them to make a mini book about your day.
- Make your own pictures/paintings of London scenes or the landscape.
- Spot and talk about different types of vehicles while you are out with your family. Make a list of all the different vehicles you have seen.
- With an adult, search the web for facts about London. i.e. How many people live in London? What is the tallest building? Where does the Queen live? Where does the Prime Minister live?
- Walk around Feltham, or where you live. Look for places of interest. i.e. the train station, the bridge, the duck pond, churches, the shopping centre, schools, the library, the police station, Tesco, Asda, etc. Make a map of the area.
- Make a mini book of a walk round Feltham, London or another city. Write/draw and label what you saw.
- Ask your grown up to show you how to google images of landmarks in London.
- Make a model of a famous building or structure that you would find in London. If you cannot go to London then look for information and images on the internet.
- Pretend you are on the moon looking down at Earth. Find an aerial view of England/London/Feltham/Your house on Google maps. Draw your own aerial map.
- Visit your local library and search for non-fiction, fiction and/or poetry books about cities. Write down some things you learned or enjoyed reading about in the books.
- Make a United Kingdom flag.
- Visit the London Zoo website. Write down some things you have found out. You might be able to find 2 for 1 tickets!
- Learn some songs about London i.e. London's Burning, London Bridge is falling down. Find them on You Tube (with a grown up).
- Learn to recite number bonds to 10 $1+9=10$ $2+8=10$ $3+7=10$ $4+6=10$ $5+5=10$ $6+4=10$ $7+3=10$ $8+2=10$ $9+1=10$
- Learn how to read and spell: you, they, her, all, are, said, so, have, like, some, come.
