

This is a list of activities for you to choose and enjoy doing with your child. Choose one activity a week. You do not have to do all of the activities or in a specific order.

## <u>Geography</u>

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- Draw a map of the area you live in. If you can, Include a 'Key'.
- Take a walk around your area and write down any human and physical features you find. Examples of physical features- Hills, lakes, rivers Examples of human features- Shops, traffic lights, stations
- Research the countries and capital cities in the United Kingdom. Write facts about them or label a blank map of the UK.
- Research the seas that surround the UK.

### Science:

- Take a walk outside and look for seasonal changes of winter. E.g. trees don't have leaves, frost on the ground. Draw a picture.
- Keep a diary of the weather for a week. What do you notice?

### <u>Art:</u>

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Create a winter collage. You could use natural materials or something you have at home.

### Maths

- Search for objects around your house write down what 3D shape they are.
- Collect two piles of objects (up to 20). Add the piles together.
- Use first, then and now to make an addition or subtraction number story. •
